# Education

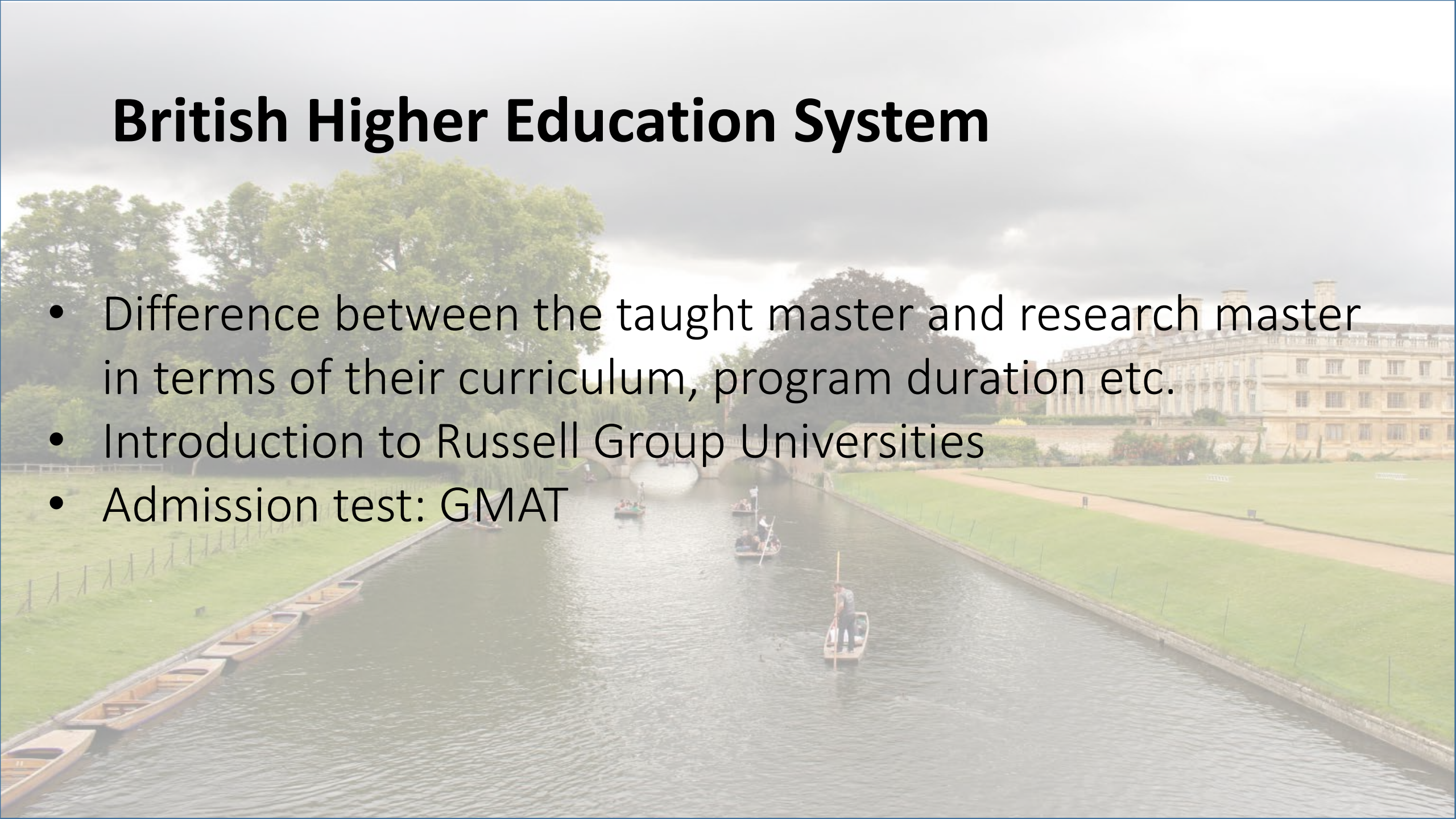

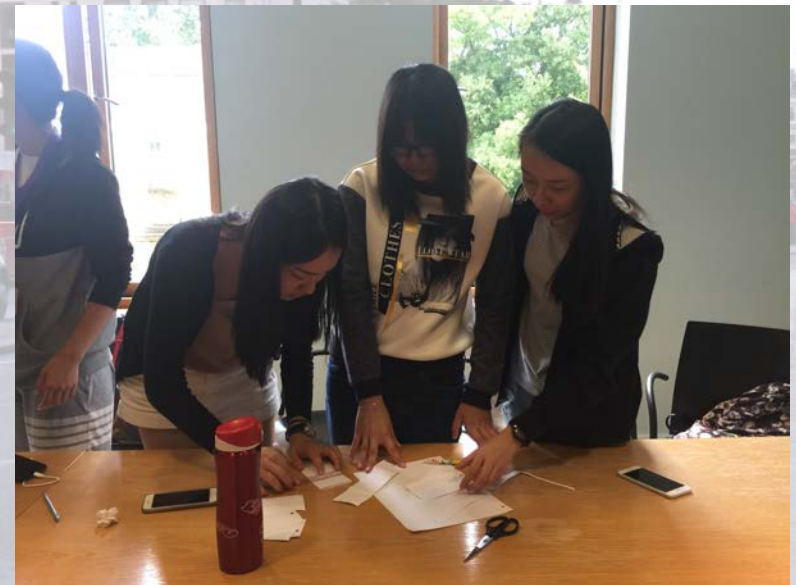

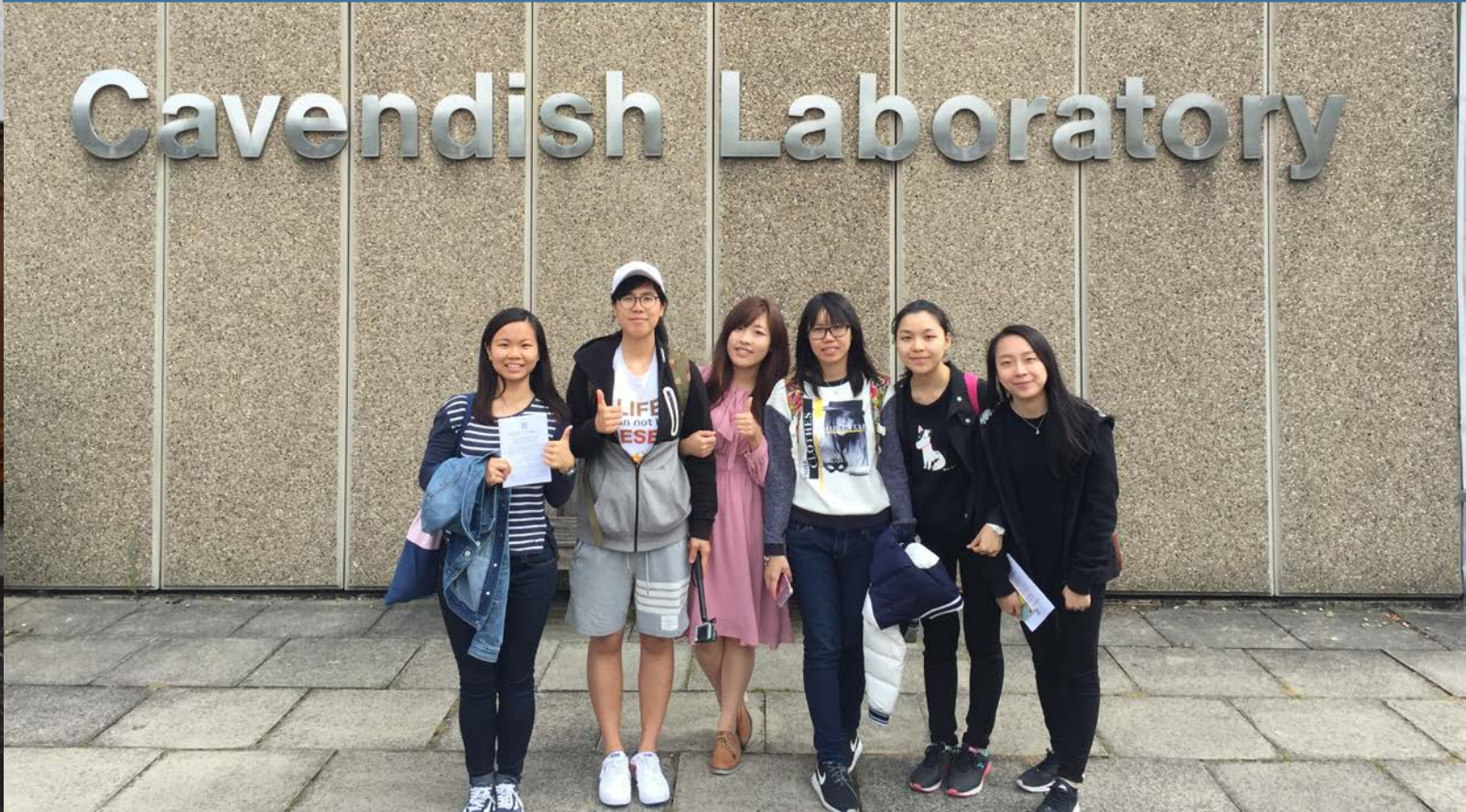
